MEDIA ARTS HISTORY OF CANMORE


As a former coal-town marking the gates of Alberta's rockies Canmore is a cultural hub. Home of Mozart on the Mountain, Canmore Winter festival and artsPeak Arts Festival Canmore is a destination for arts and cultural events for the Bow Valley and beyond. Recognizing a need for organization in the arts Canmore's Public art program was established in 1996 almost 20 years after Canmore's coal mine shut down and eight years after the '88 Olympics were held at the Canmore Nordic Centre. In 2015 artsPlace opened to the public as a much needed hub for artists. As the largest town near Bow Valley and Kananaskis Provincial parks Canmore is base camp for movies being filmed in the Albertan Rockies. The Rockies have been a film location since the 60's, starting with westerns and survival adventures.




